There are many websites that exist to generate images with a text prompt. One of the most popular ones is called DALL-E.

On Tuesday, January 5th, 2021, Artificial

Intelligence company OpenAI released a blog post titled "DALL-E: Creating -Images from Text."

Midterm elections not what GOP hoped for

The 2022 United States midterm elections have officially ended, and it is one for the history books.

The 2022 election ended with the GOP winning the House of Representatives, and although this appears to be a major win for the Republican party, it is a little more complex than that.

Leading up to the midterms, Republicans all across the country had been predicting what they called a "red wave". This supposed "red wave" was supposed to cause the republicans to not only win the house of representatives, but the senate as well. However, this is not what happened at all.

When the dust settled, Republicans had only picked up 9 seats in the house, and although this was enough to gain a majority, this is highly disappointing to a Republican party who was expecting to pick up 30 or maybe even 40 seats.

In the Senate, things went even worse for Republicans. They actually lost one seat, and the Democratic Party maintained their majority.

That caused this so-called "red wave" to fizzle out and become a massive morale blow to Republicans started with the senate race in Pennsylvania where an open seat was up for grabs due to the retirement of Doug Toomey, a Republican senator. This opened the gates for two new candidates to become the next senator of Pennsylvania. Mehmet Oz, otherwise known as "Dr.Oz", was the candidate for

the Republican party, while John Fetterman was the Democratic candidate.

In the months leading up to the election the Democratic candidate, John Fetterman had a stroke. This severely damaged his campaign due to the public's concern for his health. This cut his lead in the polling from a multiple point lead to a 1 point deficit. When election night rolled around, the polls showed a 1.5 point lead for Oz, but as the votes started to roll on, it became more and more clear that the race was going to be much tighter than perceived.

As election night came to a close, the race between Oz and Fetterman was still too close to call and would continue into the following days but when the race was called, Fetterman had won by nearly 5 points. This was a massive blow to republican morale.

This loss, combined with others, in Nevada and Arizona senate races let Republicans down with a loss of one seat, and although they would have a chance to break even in the Georgia run-off election, even that would prove unsuccessful when Raphael Warnock would go on to defeat Herschel Walker.

The midterms ended in the senate with Democrats picking up one seat and massively over performing every expectation.

In the house, things would go better for Republicans but not by much.

They would end up picking up 9 seats, and winning the majority, but this was still largely seen as a victory for the Democrats because they were expected to lose somewhere between 20-40 seats.



FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022

The 2022 World Cup, held in the middle-eastern country of Qatar, taken the world by storm. The World Cup is a worldwide soccer tournament that consists of the thirty-two best soccer teams in the world competing to win it all and bring home the trophy for their country.

Due to it only occurring every four years, many people who do not even care for the sport of soccer show support for their country.

The official song for the 2022 World Cup, the song chosen was "Tukoh Taka" by Nicki Minaj.

Many fans have taken to the internet to express their dissatisfaction with the official song. Popular YouTube creator Darren Watkins Jr; also known online as IShowSpeed, has recently become popular among soccer fans for creating what fans are deeming "The Unofficial World Cup Song". The song, titled "World Cup", has garnered 42 million views in the one month since its release.

Thirty-two teams qualify for every World Cup and the teams that qualify are randomly selected and placed into eight

groups of four (Group A through Group H). Each team will play the other three teams in their group and after all matches have been played only the top two teams of each group will progress to the Round of 16 or Knockout Stage.

In the group stage matches, if a team wins they receive 2 points, if they tie the team they are playing, they receive 1 point, and if they lose, they receive no points.

The Knockout Stage and following stages consist of single-elimination matches in which there will be a decided winner at the end of each match. After the Knockout Stage, the eight remaining teams will progress to the Quarter-Finals, then, the remaining four teams will progress to the Semi-Finals, and finally, the last two remaining teams will compete for the title of world champions in the World Cup Final.

Each qualifying country recruits or "calls up" the twenty-six best players of their country for the opportunity for them to sign a contract with their national team. Each team then decides which eleven of their players will start for them and the other fifteen are able to be substituted in throughout the duration of any of the matches.

For the first time since 2014, the United States had qualified for the World

On December 9, 2022, Brazil faced off against Croatia in the Round of 8. While Brazil was favored to win the match, Croatia would be able to upset the South American team in a penalty shootout to punch their ticket to the Semi-Finals with a final score of 1-1 (full-time) 4-2 (penalty shootout).

All games of the World Cup have been broadcasted in the United States on Fox Sports. The November 29th matchup between England and the United States received 15.4 million views across the US. This number now holds the record for the most watched soccer match on U.S. television.

On Sunday, December 18, 2022, the stage had been set for the World Cup Final. The match would be played between France and Argentina.

their France made second consecutive appearance in the World Cup Final, winning the 2018 World Cup, hosted in Russia, with a final score of 4-2 against Croatia. They hoped to become one of the few nations to win back-toback World Cups.

Argentina, led by superstar Lionel Messi, would be trying to win their third World Cup, Messi's first.

The Link Between Mental Health & Procrastination

Many people believe that procrastination is just someone "being lazy"; however, what they do not see is the large effect that stress, anxiety, perfectionism, and depression actually have on procrastination.

Procrastinating is a coping mechanism; people use it to cope with their negative feelings. Forbes writer Amy Blaschka in her online article "You're Not Lazy; You're Scared: How To Finally Stop Procrastinating" said, "When we procrastinate, we're avoiding unpleasant task and doing something else that gives us a temporary mood boost.'

Procrastination can also affect a person's physical health. According to an article from McLean Harvard Medical School "Why You Put Things Off Until the Last Minute," it can cause irregular eating patterns, sleep deprivation, and unhealthy regimens.

When someone procrastinates, they are aware of what they are doing. In an interview with Forbes, professor Timothy Pychyl, at Carleton University in Ottawa studies procrastination, said this behavior is "Giving in to feel good."

According to Blaschka, when faced with the guilt and shame of procrastinating, people will do it even more. This creates a self-defeating cycle. "Eventually, you're left with the tasks to complete, the negative emotions again, plus the added stress of a time constraint.'

Those who are procrastinators, 20% of the population, are less likely to express their needs, according to The Creatives Hour.

Chronic procrastination can affect both mental and physical health. It can lead to chronic stress, depression, anxiety, illness, chronic hypertension, and cardiovascular disease.

According writer to Amy Novotney's article from the American Psychological Association, "Procrastination or 'intentional delay,' states that earlier in the semester students who procrastinate reported lower levels of stress and less illness.

Later the in semester procrastinators reportedly have higher levels of stress and illness. The students who procrastinate are more likely to receive lower grades on assignments.

86% of high school students say procrastinate their they on assignments, according to the National University's article "Helping Students Overcome Procrastination."

The online blog site "Thrive My

The results were; 80 to 95% of college students say they procrastinate, and 50% of them believe it is an actual issue for them.

15 to 20% of adults procrastinate regularly. 88% of the people they surveyed said that they procrastinate for at least an hour. Only 20% of the population struggles with chronic procrastination, according to Blaschka.

There are so many reasons as to why a student may procrastinate, such as fear, indecisiveness, stress, or anxiety. It is different for every student.

Most forms of procrastination involve stress and anxiety. Perfectionism has a large effect on both of those. Lethbridge According to the Undergraduate Research Journal "Why Procrastinate," by Neal Thakkar, perfectionism works in three different ways.

Self-oriented perfectionism when people place high standards on themselves. It tends to have a small effect on procrastination.

Other-oriented perfectionism is when people place high standards on other people. This type of perfectionism does not have an effect on procrastination and is more likely to decrease it.

Lastly, there is socially-prescribed perfectionism. Students feel as though other people have high expectations of them. They feel an immense amount of pressure from not their teachers, but their peers as well.

Students feel like they have to come up with good ideas and be able to understand something on the first try, and it causes students to procrastinate on their work.

Stress and Resilience Institute's "5 Styles of Perfectionism," adds to sociallyprescribed perfectionism with overt and covert perfectionism.

Overt perfectionists have a strong need for schedule and show increased signs of anxiety. They are opinionated and like to be right. They avoid doing things they do not understand or cannot do well with.

This type of perfectionist has a fixed mindset. They fear failure and will do everything they can to prevent it from happening by being in control.

Covert perfectionists are hard to identify. Their actions do not always match the thoughts in their head. They have low expectations of the people around them and will say they prefer being laid back, but they want to succeed.

The Guardian writer Priscilla Way," did a survey over procrastination. Emokpaire talks about three different

types of procrastination in her article "Procrastination as a Healthy Coping Mechanism." The first type Emokpaire mentions is active procrastination. This type purposefully delays doing a task to " harness the pressure that comes from being behind on a deadline as motivation to get tasks done."

This form of procrastination is viewed as a positive one, as it is linked to academic success and positive psychological health.

The next type is productive procrastination. It is when someone is delaying a task of higher importance by other beneficial things.

The last type of procrastination is passive. This is when someone thinks that putting off a task will help ease the stress by choosing something that will give short-term gratification, like scrolling through social media, thus leaving far worse negative feelings toward the original task.

Another common reason as to why people procrastinate is fear. "Why You Put Things Off Until the Last Minute," says "The more anxiety we experience about a task, the more likely we are we'll put it off until later."

Fear is very closely related to perfectionism. People will delay doing something because they fear it is not perfect. One is afraid of being criticized or making a mistake or feeling embarrassed.


Procrastinating a task out of fear is a sign of anxiety. People may avoid doing something simply just because they are afraid of the outcome. It could be a positive or negative outcome, but the anxiety of knowing that result stops them from doing it.

Depression also has an effect on procrastination. With depression, it causes low levels of energy and lack of motivation. It can be hard for someone to gather the energy to do a task, so they will put it off. It can also be difficult to measure if someone feels motivated enough to do a task, according to material published by McLean Harvard Medical School.

There is the possibility that people procrastinate because of ADHD. Procrastination is a symptom of inattentive type of ADHD. McLean Harvard Medical stated that people with ADHD "...can have difficulty regulating attention, staying organized, and can be easily distracted. They can also struggle with aspects of executive functioning, including working memory, flexible thinking, and self-control."

Hyper fixation is another part of it that causes people to procrastinate. When someone becomes fixated on a task they enjoy, they will avoid the less enjoyable tasks. When they are focused on this task, they will lose track of time and lose awareness in their environment, according to McLean Harvard Medical.

There is more to procrastination than "just being lazy." A person's mental health largely affects one's ability to do a























Congress's Newest Subject: Ticketmaster

The United States Congress is holding a hearing over Ticketmaster's latest scam. Time and time again, Ticketmaster has shown how they abuse their privileges in the ticket sales industry.

The announcement of Taylor Swift's first tour in five years created an immediate reaction by her fans, many of whom already started to plan outfits, book hotels, and more before tickets went on sale.

For Ticketmaster's presale event, people had to sign up for a maximum of three shows to possibly be selected for. After two weeks, Ticketmaster would email the people selected for presale. This is where the first problem started. Ticketmaster decided that they would send the presale codes all throughout the day rather than at one time. Some fans received their code at eight in the morning while others received theirs just before midnight. This left many fans disappointed after a full day of not receiving a code.

The day of the sale was a hundred times worse than anyone imagined it would be. Anyone with or without a code could get into the queue. Two million people received a code, but fourteen million people were in the queue when the sale started. Because of the alarming amount of people on the server, the

website crashed. Millions of fans were left on the website waiting for up to eight hours.

One of the main purposes for the Ticketmaster presale is to keep bots from buying tickets and reselling them, but due to Ticketmaster's poor planning, that is exactly what ended up happening. Many bots were able to get through the queue and purchase tickets. These tickets are being resold for up to \$18,000.

Fans that were left empty-handed, hoped that they would get their chance during the next two sales. The Capital One card sale took place the next day and, for many people, was a last resort. This sale started off the same way with the website crashing and fans being left disappointed. After this second sale, Ticketmaster made a public announcement canceling their general on sale that was to take place after a few days. This meant that all the tickets had been sold when they were supposed to keep enough to sell for each sale.

This event shined a light on Ticketmaster's nonsense and was brought to the United States Congress. Swift and her team had asked Ticketmaster if they were able to handle the demand that was going to take place, and they were assured that they could handle it.


A Congress representative spoke out about the hearing saying, "That's why we will hold a hearing on how consolidation in the live entertainment and ticketing industry harms customers and artists alike. When there is no competition to incentivize better services and fair prices, we all suffer the consequences."

Ticketmaster shows how they are corrupt and untrustworthy every time they sell tickets. Administrators have the ability to up their ticket prices at any given chance, so when they notice a mass amount of people on the sale, they raise their prices to receive more revenue.

After buying overpriced tickets, Ticketmaster adds more fees up to \$30 per ticket. These fees are for things such as service fees and pre-sale fees. The amount they are charging for these fees is ridiculous, especially when the service fees are sometimes more than the ticket itself.

Taylor Swift, her fans, and congress are all disappointed in Ticketmaster's performance. The Congress has sole authority to enact legislation, so Ticketmaster's ticket selling rights could be taken away.

The public hasn't been told a date for the hearing yet, but many eager fans wait to see if Ticketmaster stays a money hungry company or gets rightfully taken down.

A Spotlight On Domestic Violence

More than 600,000 people go missing every year in the U.S, but it is uncommon for a missing persons case to be followed by the public. The Gabby Petito case captured the public's eye in late 2021.

The nation was so entranced by the case that Lifetime produced a crimethriller called "The Gabby Petito Story." The film is based upon the events of the Petito case. Lifetime premiered the film on October 1, and even though the movie is about their family member, the Petito family did not approve the movie making. The Petito family even said that they wanted no connection to the movie. Reviews of the movie say there was some fiction involved in the new movie. Movie watchers should know the true story before watching the movie.

Gabby Petito and her boyfriend, Brian Laundrie, started traveling the country together in early 2019. Petito documented their travels on Instagram, Youtube, and TikTok.

On August 12, 2021, Petito and Laundrie were stopped by police after a witness called claiming that the couple was having what seemed to be a "domestic problem" in Moab, Utah. The caller said the couple was arguing and Laundrie slapped Petito across the face.

Laundrie claimed that after spending so much time together in the van, that it led the couple to fight more than normal. "They are in love and engaged to be married and desperately didn't wish to see anyone charged with a crime," Laundrie had said.

After the police called the episode an emotional breakdown, Laundrie stayed the night in a hotel, while Petito stayed the night in the van.

On September 1, Laundrie returned to his and Petito's home. Only, Petito was not with him. After Petito's

family was not able to get in touch with her, they decided to report her missing to North Port police on September 11. Investigators went to Laundrie's home after finding the couple's van there. Laundrie quickly became a person of importance to the case, due to being the last person to have seen Petito. Unfortunately for investigators, Laundrie was not cooperating with the investigation at all.

North Port Police Chief Todd Garrison implored everyone, including Laundrie, with information on Petito to share it with police.

On September 17, the Laundrie family calls police to their home claiming they haven't seen their son since September 14. At this point in the case, the FBI is both looking for Petito and Laundrie. The Laundrie family believed he went on a hike. North Port police then start searching for Laundrie at the Carlton Reserve in Venice, Florida.

Unfortunately, on September 19 human body remains were found in Bridger-Teton National Forest. A forensic identification had not been done at this point, but the remains matched the description of Petito. The remains were later confirmed to be Petito on September 21

On September 23, the FBI issued a federal arrest warrant for Laundrie, charging him with "use of unauthorized access devices." Laundrie had used a debit card and pin for accounts that were not his. The accounts were charged with 1,000 dollars between August 30 and September 1

On October 12 ,one month after Petito was reported missing, the remains found were confirmed to be Petito's and was confirmed a homicide. According to Dr. Blue, a coroner in Teton County, Petito was strangled to death. After more than three weeks of searching for Laundrie, human remains were found at Florida's Carlton Reserve with a backpack and a notebook. On October 21, a day after finding the remains, the dental records of Laundrie matched the human remains.

On November 23, a medical examiner's office in Florida determined that Laundrie took his own life. By using the notebook that was alongside the remains, authorities were able to find that Laundrie had taken Petito's life. The FBI had also found that Laundrie had tried to "deceive" law enforcement into believing Petito was still alive by creating texts between their two phones.

The Gabby Petito case will be recalled often by the news, crime enthusiasts, and crime podcasts. It also reminded the nation that domestic violence happens in our nation. According to national statistics, one in four women and one in seven men will experience violence by a partner.

More locally, according to Tennessee Crime Stats in both 2020 and 2019, there were 313 victims in Hickman County. In these years, people were staying home due to COVID-19 and the resulting quarantine. It seems that the more the victims stay home, the more likely they will face domestic abuse.

In 2021, the year Petito went missing, the rate of domestic abuse victims went down 15 percent with 256 victims.

There are ways to get help with facing domestic abuse. One way to get help is by calling the National Domestic Violence Hotline (800-799-7233), or by visiting the National Domestic Violence Hotline website (thehotline.org).

Midterm Elections Not What GOP Hoped For



International Civil Resistance: Actions from Climate Change Activists

Recent civil resistance on a global scale focuses on fossil fuels. Global warming activists have been organizing and non-violently protesting in countries spanning the western and eastern hemispheres. Every major country has some sort of activist group bringing attention to the problem of global warming. Each protest they have done has been non-violent, showing their commitment to humanity that they only wish to help.

"We are the Last Generation of the old world. We are here today to say we will create a new world – where humanity embraces itself, forgives itself, loves itself, and commits to continue our great adventure." A non-violent international protest organization called "A22 Network " starts its declaration, declared in April 0f 2022, with these sentences, followed by a sad truth and their overall truth and plan. "-we are not here to highlight, plead or to entertain. We are here to reach for the change that is required for this to happen. We are here to force governments to slash carbon emissions, nothing less. We are here for action, not words." "A22 Network" has organized and mobilized many protest groups across the globe carrying out civil disobedience because it is their responsibility to protect humanity.

"Just Stop Oil" is a "coalition of groups working together" situated in the UK that is non-violently protesting the present and future use of fossil fuels in the UK. Their demand is "that the UK government makes a statement that it will immediately halt all future licensing and consents for the exploration, development, and production of fossil fuels in the UK" because the burning of fossil fuels is slowly killing humanity, and we should switch to clean, renewable energy. "Just Stop Oil" has made its mark in the media with its protests and demonstrations such as throwing tomato soup on Van Gogh's "Sunflower" painting, painting a Ferrari dealership orange, covering the Silver Fin building in orange paint, and other means of non-violent protest. "Just Stop Oil" isn't the only global activist group making headlines.

One protest organization has made it into our very own country. "Declare Emergency" demands that President Biden needs to "declare a formal state of climate emergency and begin to make full use of his executive authority to save this country from collapse." They want Biden to stand up to the rising climate problems and be the president to be the change. The first trial of protests in the country happened on I- 395 at New York Ave in Washington, DC. While it ended with the two protesters arrested, it'll be the first of many protests and trials

"Pass legislation to immediately end ALL Old Growth logging in the province of British Columbia." The "Save Old Growth" Campaign wants to preserve the forests of British Columbia because they "act as an essential carbon sink; they hold the soil and reduce the risk and severity of floods and landslides; they act as a natural barrier to wild fires, are home to many endangered species and are culturally and spiritually significant ancestors of these lands."

Canada's Prime Minister, Justin

Trudeau, supports this campaign and plans to further support the group by funding projects to help save the Old Growth forests. This project is likely the most successful because it gathered the support of Canada's prime minister, and a poll taken in 2022 reports 82% of British Columbians support legislation to ban all logging in the province.

Sweden's global activist group has been on the move to restore the wetlands of Sweden. About 25% of the carbon emissions in Sweden are from the dry wetlands that have been drained for peat mining. Peat mining is also considered unsustainable since peat grows back 1 mm a year. Peat releases more carbon than both oil and coal making the banning of peat mining ever so more important. The "Restore Wetlands" group has already made some success in creating motion in the legal system but is still far away from achieving its goal.

Germany is home to the "Letzte Generation" or "Last Generation." Their goal is similar to the UK group's goals and ultimately similar to the other activist groups' goals. This group has adopted hunger strikes in their protests with seven protesters taking part in the strike. "In August 2021, seven young people set up camp in the government district of Berlin.

On Monday, August 30th, 2021, they went on an indefinite hunger strike." After almost a whole month of starvation and three hospital visits, only two of the seven remained on strike. "Lea Bonasera and Henning Jeschke now addressed the eventual election winner Olaf Scholz personally and, after 27 days without food and a 7-hour thirst strike, finally achieved a commitment to a public discussion about the climate emergency." This hunger strike will most likely go down as one of the most famous hunger strikes in history.

Even New Zealand has been affected by global activists. "We are demanding the government restore passenger rail services to at least year 2000 levels in alignment with Te Tiriti justice with affordable, accessible services. This will connect 3.5 million

New Zealanders, save money, save lives, reduce inequality and help to tackle the climate crisis and ecological collapse we are now experiencing." The "Restore Passenger Rail" group has been pushing for the reinstatement of railway lines across the country to lower emissions and a multitude of other serious problems.

On the New Zealand activist website, they explain why they protest and disrupt the public. "The long history of civil resistance has shown that change has come by people taking bold disruptive action that ensures people pay attention. Being liked is not a prerequisite to success, in fact most of today's social justice heroes were despised and hated in their time. We do not take action in the hope of being loved in the future, but because we deeply believe we have a moral obligation to resist the demise of all hold dear. Recent history of environmentalist activism also shows that writing submissions, signing petitions, protests and occupations of sensitive sites like tree protection or blocking heavy

machinery has failed to bring about the large scale change that is now desperately needed." This quote perfectly sums up how all the movements will eventually change the world for the better because their methods have been proven to work in the past just like other historical movements such as the Civil Rights Movement, Women's Suffrage, and the ACT Up movement.

Other movements that haven't been mentioned before can be found in Italy, France, Norway, Ukraine, Australia, and Switzerland.

A common quote found among all these movements' websites is "We have to move rapidly. What we do over the next 3 to 4 years, I believe is going to determine the future of humanity" – Sir David King, Former Chief Scientific Advisor to the British Government. Sir David King is a world-renowned scientist that has been a major activist in climate made change. King has contributions to climate change awareness such as his book The Hot Topic: How to Tackle Global Warming and Still Keep the Lights On. King is also a strong supporter of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change.

"The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is the United Nations body for assessing the science related to climate change." The IPCC creates and provides assessment reports on the current climate, addressing current issues and proposing solutions or mitigations. The IPCC is currently in its sixth assessment cycle, working on its Assessment Report working together with multiple other groups. "The Working Group III" made the latest report in the Sixth Assessment Report on April 2, 2022. The report provides "an updated global assessment of climate change mitigation progress and pledges, and examines the sources of global emissions. It explains developments in emission reduction and mitigation efforts, assessing the impact of national climate pledges in relation to long-term emissions goals." Their report provides an extensive overview of their key findings and their solutions or mitigations.

The world will recognize the works of the A22 Network and its many sub-organizations as time goes on. Their methods create talking points and force the spotlight onto their cause: the climate crisis. Their methods have been shown to work and bring attention to their cause. Each cause has done extensive research to support them, and it goes to show how serious climate change is. The world will eventually crumble under the weight of humanity— it's only a matter of time. To learn more about climate change, readers should research, educate, and take responsibility for shaping the future.
